**1.Welcome** Meeting commenced at 7pm. Welcome to new attendees.

  - JB, LK and KMacP to discuss coffee meeting for parents in the process of being organised
  - JB and AW to look at PC page on new website JB and JH now to look at access still required
  - SD to email SR re classroom temperature done. There are no Covid measures in place at the moment. Windows are generally open for ventilation but can close if cold
  - SR to arrange for refresh on toilet break guidance to pupils delicate subject and down to teachers Judgement – assemblies may be the way to emphasise
  - SR to canvass interest for replacement for IMacG Chelsea Wilson is Irene's support for learning role and has agreed to attend PC meetings
  - PE teachers to monitor cleanliness of changing rooms down to Mitie. Will not clean
    during school hours. It has been a difficult time due to flooding which caused
    extensive damage. Managed to avert from hall due to barricade but was cleared
    overnigh and school opened next day. Some students displaced and some doors and
    carpets replaced. Measures put in place to stop the drains backing up in future.
  - LK to take prom issues to NW Locality meeting Meeting at the end of September.
     There is talk of pulling back from formal events. SR said Prom Committee agree with
     this cost of living and cost to the school. Ideas taken back to the wider group.

#### 3. Headteachers Report

SQA results – hard to compare at the moment. Three are a lot of appeals. The appeals process will probably be pared back in the next few years. S5 did really well but some others didn't do as well. Have some insight but for reports, comparator across the country will be out tomorrow.

There are shortages of teachers in many subjects, with a lot of red tape and bottlenecks. Cover teachers in school have been reduced by re-writing the

timetables and teachers have been deployed to other classes. There is cover in English at the moment and are waiting on the advert to go live. Tome was here for a year on a temporary basis but is now permanent.

PEF – maternity leave in early October. Three will be an email going out about parent help for Saturday morning football. Modern Studies was previously covered by non-specialist. Maths currently on hold – looking at flexibility and the advert is now closed.

Duke of Edinburgh (DofE)— everyone is keen on this. The library always has something going on — currently book festival. English has excursions planned. Extra curricular activities — hoping to have football teams for s1, S2 and S3.

There is an ongoing national shortage of teachers, CDT especially. There are extra resources online – BBC Bitesize, E-Sgoil for example. There is not as much homework – S3 pupils need to do own research/learning.

Show my Homework(SMHW) — some parents still getting notifications through Satchel One. Parent access to Teams still being looked at, need background permission from the Council. There is a numeracy/literacy powepoint which is available on the school website and can maybe look into getting this sent out. Homework puts extra pressure on teachers. Going to try and get a meeting with Cllr Euan Davidson. Possibly look at sending list of questions in advance.

Parents night will be Face to Face (F2F) this year. The Wellbeing Hub/Equality/Extra Support Base (ESB) are working really well for students. Re-connecting with the school through planned intervention getting students back into school. There is also a programme to develop skills which will have an impact beyond the bounds of school, working on behaviours.

ESB has had a change of management – new curriculum lead. S1-S2 – what happens next – looking at programmes and links. Young carers – S2-S6 assembly held and S1 this week.

Black History month in November – show racism the red card.

YPI – further bake sale on 28 September for the charity that won last year – Edinburgh Childrens Charity. They also went to the Grange Manor care home and organised afternoon tea/bingo

#### 4. PC Workstream Priorities Discussion:

- Website currently the website is constantly being populated. JB & JH to meet with SR to get access to the pages etc – engagement with school/carers
- Email social skills/youth club/counselling set up survey. Hard to get to pupils after S2 and need early engagement should aim to get to the pupils before P6. PC remit would be to get survey circulated as widely as possible. Places are closing existing clubs etc. Have already done parental focus groups. Only the school can do a survey to pupils ethical permissions. Can

gather ideas – Sighthill has clubs etc – what's out there in other areas? Posters in library? Eg Gate 55 – not well advertised but is council funded. Is there a gap I certain areas? Why aren't existing clubs being used? Broomhouse Hub has different things for different age groups. Could groups come into the school to promote the clubs?. There is a gap with S2/S3 parents – haven't had F2F for 2 years. Could there be a separate event for these years as well as the wider parental group? Looking for volunteers to brainstorm for ideas.

- Wider achievements curtailed for 2 years this has affected pupils. For example there used to be activities week. DofE everyone has access to this but there is an associated cost. There is also a science club. Parents evening the dates should be on the website can we get PC volunteers? Issue annual comms re role of PC.
- CV/Interview skills JS/LK to pick up with John re Christmas leavers. 4 sessions held at other schools one interview today and 2 now have jobs. Now have the use of community centre at Gyle Park but no WIFi good for 1-2-1 sessions and small groups.
