The Transition Process

P6:

June: primary school teachers will identify children who will benefit from our Positive Start Programme

P7:

October: Parents/carers and P7s will be invited to an Open Afternoon to see what Forrester High School is like.

November: Forrester High School Support for Learning staff will meet the P7s and work with the primary staff to plan Positive Start Groups.

November - May: the Positive Start Groups will work with High School staff to become familiar with the school, it's staff and it's processes.

January - March: primary school staff will begin to share information with the High School. They will share attainment levels, support required, successful strategies to support learning and other useful information.

April/May: High School staff will visit the primary schools to meet the P7s and their teachers. Work will happen in P7 to support transition. Some current S1s may also visit to answer questions.

June: parents/carers will be invited to an information session at the High School. All children will attend a three-day visit to the High School.

Please note: all places for S1 are allocated through City of Edinburgh Council, not the High School.

FAQS





How long is a school day?

Monday – Thursday, school starts with a warning bell at 8.25 and finishes at 3.25.

On a Friday, it is the same start time, but we finish at 12.05

How long do we get for lunch?

50 minutes

There is also a 15 minute break every morning.

Do we get homework every day?

You will get some homework every day but not for every subject. Some subjects you get every day and others only once a week so it varies. Teachers will let you know what to do and when to do it by.

Is there a Breakfast Club?

There is a fantastic breakfast club that runs every morning from 8am.

We don't want you to be hungry going to class!

How many classes do we have a day?

Monday - Thursday there are 6 classes a day.

On Friday there are 4.

Is it hard to get around the building?

To begin with, the school might feel huge, but once you know where classes are it will start to feel smaller. The corridors are colour coded and there are lots of signs to help you.

There are always lots of people around to ask too.



How do we get school uniform?

Do we get lockers?

When lockers are available, you will get the opportunity to request a locker. Sometimes there is a waiting list.

You will have an account which people at home can put money into online or you can put money into using machines in the school. You will have a pin number to use when you pay for food. You won't use cash.

You will have two classes - a tutor class and a practical class. You will find out about this on your first day in the school.

Teachers will post homework on your class Teams page so that you can access it. You will have an iPad that you take home with you every night to support with this.

Every house has a Pupil Support Leader (guidance) and a House Head. Each class also has a Daily Morning Tutor who they see every morning. There might be Pupil Support Assistants in some of your classes too.
